

## Career Competency Combination: Public Policy Analysis

### Introduction:

This career competency combination is designed to draw together courses in the liberal arts disciplines that will prepare students for professional careers, either in the public or the private sector, in public policy analysis. In the private sector they may work in corporate governmental relations offices or work for private non-profit organizations. In these organizations, they may be called upon to interpret and implement governmental regulations or to advocate changes in public policy. Competency in any of these positions requires some knowledge of political institutions and processes, the history of governmental policy, economic analysis, and the ability to compile, interpret, and communicate relevant information.
